CLAUSES INCORPORATED BY FULL TEXT

5352.242-9000 CONTRACTOR ACCESS TO AIR FORCE INSTALLATIONS (MAY 2002)

(a) The contractor shall obtain base identification and vehicle passes for all contractor personnel who make frequent visits to or perform work on the Air Force installation(s) cited in the contract. Contractor personnel are required to wear or prominently display installation identification badges or contractor-furnished, contractor identification badges while visiting or performing work on the installation.

(b) The contractor shall submit a written request on company letterhead to the contracting officer listing the following: contract number, location of work site, start and stop dates, and names of employees and subcontractor employees needing access to the base. The letter will also specify the individual(s) authorized to sign for a request for base identification credentials or vehicle passes. The contracting officer will endorse the request and forward it to the issuing base pass and registration office or security police for processing. When reporting to the registration office, the authorized contractor individual(s) should provide a valid driver's license, current vehicle registration, valid vehicle insurance certificate, and I.D. Card to obtain a vehicle pass.

- (c) During performance of the contract, the contractor shall be responsible for obtaining required identification for newly assigned personnel and for prompt return of credentials and vehicle passes for any employee who no longer requires access to the work site.
- (d) When work under this contract requires unescorted entry to controlled or restricted areas, the contractor shall comply with AFI 31-101, Volume 1, The Air Force Installation Security Program, and AFI 31-501, Personnel Security Program Management, as applicable.
- (e) Upon completion or termination of the contract or expiration of the identification passes, the prime contractor shall ensure that all base identification passes issued to employees and subcontractor employees are returned to the issuing office.
- (f) Prior to submitting an invoice for final payment, the prime contractor shall obtain a clearance certification from the issuing office which states all base identification passes have been turned in, accounted for, or transferred to a follow-on contract. This certification shall be submitted to the contracting officer prior to submission of the final invoice for payment.
- (g) Failure to comply with these requirements may result in withholding of final payment.

SUBMISSION OF INVOICES: The contractor will be paid monthly on the submission of proper invoices for the services performed or supplies furnished during the preceding month. Invoices shall be submitted on a monthly basis covering the items furnished the preceding month.

STATEMENT OF WORK **7 AUG 03**
FITNESS CENTER CARDIOVASCULAR/GYM EQUIPMENT

Contractor shall provide preventative maintenance and repair of specified equipment and machines located in the Keesler AFB Fitness and Sports Centers.

2. Monthly preventative maintenance and repair is defined as the inspection of each item of equipment or machines listed in this statement of work. General cleaning of machine parts and the preventative maintenance of these parts, in accordance with manufacturers recommendations for: oiling, greasing, fabricating, upholstering, adjustment, repair, and cleaning.
3. Monthly preventative maintenance and repair shall be conducted once a month on the 20th of the month. (If the 20th falls on a weekend or holiday, then maintenance shall be accomplished on the following workday.) All work must be accomplished during work hours and will be conducted in areas that may still be in use by patrons. Normal duty hours are 07:30 to 4:30 p.m. Maintenance personnel are required to sign-in and sign-out with the fitness center staff on each visit. A logbook will be maintained at each facility.
4. Consultation with the staff on any required repairs shall be required on each visit. Contractor shall report all repairs completed, as well as repairs not completed at the completion of the visit.
5. Contractor shall coordinate with the Fitness Center Director on any upholstery materials required for the repair of all equipment and machines.
6. Contractor shall coordinate with the Fitness Center Director on the establishment of bench stock parts inventory for the repair of equipment.
7. If parts or upholstery materials are on hand, all repairs required should be accomplished during the visit.
8. Contractor shall be required to accomplish clean up of area after completion of work. Equipment may not be left in a disassembled state when leaving the facility at the completion of a visit.
9. Contractor must be properly trained and certified in the repair of equipment provided for in this contract. Contractor will be prepared with tools and instructions needed for equipment repair.
10. Contractor shall respond to emergency repair requests within eight (8) hours of request from the Athletic Director or his duty authorized representative.
11. Contractor shall respond to routine service calls within 72 hours after notification by the Athletic Director or his duty authorized representative.
12. Contractor will provide receipts for all parts installed. At time of repair the contractor must identify to the fitness center staff the specific equipment repaired.

3) **WEATHER OBSERVERS - NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY:** If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty, you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. All operations involving, unloading, storage, and hauling of ordnance, explosive, and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance, explosives, and incendiary material differential pay.

The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition, where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee, all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount, or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost), reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However, in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of "wash and wear" materials, may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments, and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning, daily washing, or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract, by the contractor, by law, or by the nature of the work, there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e., the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination), be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e., appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination. Such conformed classes of employees shall be paid the monetary wages and furnished the fringe benefits as are determined. Such conforming process shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees. The conformed classification, wage rate, and/or fringe benefits shall be retroactive to the commencement date of the contract. { See Section 4.6 (C)(vi) } When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract, a separate SF 1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed. The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid, the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation) and computes a proposed rate).
- 2) After contract award, the contractor prepares a written report listing in order proposed classification title), a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification), job description), and rationale for proposed wage rate), including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved, or where there is no authorized representative, the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the Wage and Hour Division, Employment Standards Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, for review. (See section 4.6(b)(2) of Regulations 29 CFR Part 4).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour decision to the contractor.
- 6) The contractor informs the affected employees.

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF 1444 or bond paper. When preparing a conformance request, the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations" (the Directory) should be used to compare job definitions to insure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination.
