### FRANK ROSENKRANZ, GS-12

Mr. Frank Rosenkranz is a Course Director at the 81<sup>st</sup> Training Support Squadron, Keesler Air Force Base, Mississippi. He is responsible for overseeing and facilitating the Enhanced Learning & Instructional Enrichment (ELITE) course.

Mr. Rosenkranz began his active duty Air Force career in October 1985. Following his graduation from Technical Training at Chanute Air Force Base (AFB), IL, Mr. Rosenkranz served as an Aircrew Life Support Technician completing assignments with the 82<sup>nd</sup> Flying Training Wing, Williams AFB, AZ and the 28<sup>th</sup> Air Refueling Squadron, Ellsworth AFB, SD. In 1994 Mr. Rosenkranz cross-trained as an Airborne Warning and Control Systems (AWACS) technician, assigned to the 552<sup>nd</sup> Air Control Wing, Tinker AFB, OK. During this period he supported numerous operations, including Operation Southern and Northern Watch. In 1998, Mr. Rosenkranz arrived at Keesler AFB, MS to serve as an Instructor for the Airborne Warning and Control Systems and the Joint Surveillance Target Attack Radar System (JSTARS) course. Following his instructor duty commitment, he accepted an instructor position at the Mathies Non-Commissioned Officer Academy (NCOA) where he finished his Air Force career as the Director of Resources.



In September 2008, Mr. Rosenkranz retired from the Air Force as a Master Sergeant and began his service in civil service as a training specialist for the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). In 2009 he returned to Keesler AFB as an instructor at the 336<sup>th</sup> Training Squadron teaching the Knowledge Operations Management Course. In February 2013, Mr. Rosenkranz joined the 81<sup>st</sup> TRSS, serving as a Basic Instructor Course instructor, followed by a promotion into an instructor position for the Instructor/Developer for Online Learning (IDOL) course. In 2020, prior to his current position, Mr. Rosenkranz was promoted and moved to Second Air Force as an Instructional Systems Specialist for the Air Force Career Development Academy (AFCDA).
